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1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1.1 INTRODUCTION

Sarada Charan Dey College, Kalinagar is an institution of Higher Education established in the year 1992 by a general meeting held on 13.09.1992 in Annada Charan girl's High school, Kalinagar by the initiative of local people including social workers, academicians and the representatives of people. In this meeting after a threadbare discussion unanimously resolved to establish a college in this locality to cater to the growing needs of Higher education from the current academic session 1992 and the college be named after the name of late Sarada Charan Dey, a veteran social worker and patron of learning to commemorate his sweet memory.

Sarada Charan Dey College, Kalinagar is rural Higher Educational institutions situated in the district of Hailakandi of Assam, which is affiliated to Assam University, Silchar. The college started its journey in the year 1992 by some local active and generous people with some noble vision and mission. The college initially started in its own land in a bamboo platted classrooms. After two/three years an R.C.C. building was constructed with the donation received from local M.L.A. The college obtained permission to start classes from Guwahati University in the year 1993. Then in the year 1995 after the inception of Assam University Silchar, the institution came under Assam University as affiliated College. As an affiliated College to Assam University, the institution was granted "Govt. Concurrence" on 30/08/2005. More satisfyingly, the "Assam Venture Institution's Provincialisation (of services) Act 2011, amended 2012" was enforced in the college w.e.f. 1st January 2013. Thereby Services of only 5 no. of female teaching and 8 no. of non-teaching staff had been provincialised. The college could not stand alone to improve the academic atmosphere time to time. However in the year 2021 few more posts of the teachers were provincialised. Since then joint effort has been taken and trying its level best for satisfactory academic performance besides excelling in various fields including games and sports and cultural activities. In the 2019 the college received financial aid from Rs. 50 Lakhs from State Govt. for the first time. Due to newly constructed building, (proposed three strayed building) the office of the college has been shifted which is above the flood level. Regarding Digital classroom, Digital Library, the work is in progress and expecting to be completed within a short period of time.

Vision

The college has specific vision considering the needs of the locality. The specific vision of the college are :

1. The main vision of the college is to meet student needs by creating an Educational

Environment in which students can attain a variety of goals and performance leading to the

achievement in academic and career goals.

2. To impart quality education for rural and economically backward students to meet new challenges of life and to make them good, self-reliant and capable citizens of the society.

3. To access educational opportunity in line with the needs of the community and help students meet socio-economic and cultural challenges to become active participants in shaping the society.

Mission

The College is inspired by the mission of developing spirit of excellence in both curricular and extra-curricular domain, sound values, ethos of unity in diversity and leadership qualities among the students so that they can compete in global excellence. As the locality is mainly OBC category students so in order to uplift the social status of them the college has taken all its effort to uplift the social group.

The college has been established to meet the needs of the students who are belonging to economically vulnerable section of community, so the college has given special emphasis on the quality and character building of the students who comes from the backward class.

1.2 Strength, Weakness, Opportunity and Challenges(SWOC)

Institutional Strength

Sarada Charan Dey College, a rural college in the district of Hailakandi (Assam), is easily accessible to the nearby rural areas. Most of the population of the areas belong to SC, OBC and minority categories. The strength of the institution is summarized as under:

1. Natural and healthy environment.
2. Safe and easily communicable place for students.
3. Sufficient own land for infrastructural development.
4. Free and fair environment for girl students coming from conservative family background to opt for Higher Education.
5. Students' counseling and students' grievance cell to avail the needs of the students.
6. Having a nearby Hospital, Police Out-post and PHE.

Institutional Weakness

1. The college is facing the problem of infrastructural bottlenecks. The college has established the entire infrastructure as on or before 2019 in its own funds collected from the students. Since college has to reimburse the staff payment of non-provincialized staff of the college, so it is very difficult for the authority to develop its infrastructure of the up to national level.
2. The teaching learning process of the college has been very much affected due to lack modern electronic gadgets like computer, printers, digital connectivity etc. The faculties of the college have shown their interest to install the new electronic technology, but due to the lack of proper funds position, most of the issues remain unsolved. Therefore, the college requires sufficient financial support to place the college in the new domain.

1. The majority of the students belonging to BPL category and financial condition of their parents is not so good. It can be seen that every year almost 80% of the students comes under the fee waiver scheme which indicates that their family income is less than 1lac in year. This financial hardship bound them to skip the education before of just after taking the admission in to the college.
1. The guardians of the students are mainly daily wage earners or farmers and they are very much careless about the study of their children. In case of boys, they skip the classes to help their parents in the field or engage themselves in temporary jobs to contribute in their family income. Therefore, college face the problem of drop out and absenteeism of the students during a particular season.
1. The college is facing the problem of insufficient number of faculties. Since 2021, the recruitment in the college has been due. Students come to choose particular subject but due to the lack of faculty members no new subjects have been introduce so far.

Institutional Opportunity

1. The college is situated nearby the NH- 37 and the centre point of three districts of Barak Valley of Assam viz. Cachar, Hailakandi and Karimganj. Further, there is no college within the radius of 20 km. So, the students of neighboring villages can avail the opportunity of Higher Education due to this institution.
2. There is no shortage of land area of the college. In fact college has almost 20bigha of land but major portion of the land remains unutilized due to lack of funding. Different developmental strategies have been prepared under Institutional Development Plan (IDP) including strengthen the commerce stream and opening up of science stream, Boys Hostel, Girls Hostel, staff quarter and many more for which sufficient funds is required. So, once sufficient funds release from the government then we may expect all round development of the local area.
3. The institution performs multifarious outreach activities/community services to be carried out in the neighboring villages and school. Since the college is the only higher educational institutions in the locality, so the college always ready to help its feeder institutions. As a result the feeder institutions get sufficient direction and advice from this institute and run their institutions peacefully.
4. Since the college has sufficient potentiality to cater the needs of the locality, so if the college is able to introduce Vocational and IT courses then it may give support the local students to become Atmanirvar (self-dependent). This will also create job opportunity for the college studying students.

Institutional Challenge

1. Due to recurring expenditure regarding payment of non-provincialised/ adhoc/contractual staff, the college could not materialize its plan in filed. Although the services of all the faculty staff have been provincialized, but in office we are lagging behind. The whole office of the college managed by the one lady staff, so college has appointed part time staffs in office. As a result, college has to bear additional expenditure to make their payment.

2. Majority of the students hail from the families having financial hardships which leads to higher dropout of students in the college either before completion of the course or just after the admission. The situation has been more vulnerable when the Hindustan Paper Mill Corporation suddenly locked down. Due to this financial shocks, the college has been affected most in terms of increasing drop out ratio.

3. The college is mainly Arts stream based and our target group is students of locality. The college has been provincialized just in the year 2013, so the college did not get the enough time to introduce multidisciplinary and vocational courses. As a result, most of the students are unable to complete their graduation in Arts stream only without extra co-curricular courses. As a result our students feel jobless and insecurity.

4. As the college has not accredited by NAAC, the institution is not in a position to apply for any fund provided by UGC, other than the limited plan fund from State Government, which has affected its infrastructural growth.

5. Due to non-availability of smart/digital classrooms the teaching learning process is still traditional and outdated. Although the college is trying to introduce blended learning over time in accordance to NEP 2020, but due to financial hardship we are little bit behind than the other college of the district. We have already started the process and it is expected that within the next academic year we may introduce it.

6. The area of the college is flood affected so almost every year the college face the problem of flood like situation. Since the area of the college submerged under the flood water easily, so college face financial loss almost regularly. In fact due to this flood situation it becomes difficult for the college to make addition in the existing capital or physical asset. Library has been affected most due to devastating flood situation

7. Safety and security of the college is also great concern. Since the area is rural based and at the night the whole area become dark due to power cut issue in the area so anti-social activities cases occurs many times.

The police investigate the matter but did not come in to the conclusion. As a result college has lost various valuable electronic equipment's, gadget from time to time. Over a last couple of years the situation has been changed rapidly due to consciousness of the locality but we have to do more in this direction.

1.3 CRITERIA WISE SUMMARY

Curricular Aspects

In order to ensure effective delivery of the curriculum as prescribed by the affiliating university, the college prepares its academic calendar as well as class- routines prior to commencement of each academic session. The course structure/Syllabus of different programmes are specified in the prospectus. With the help of the academic calendar the college chalks out tentative plan for both academic and non-academic activities before hand. The college strictly follows academic calendar for conducting internal assessment and seasonal tests. The College offers Courses such as B.A honours in Bengali, philosophy and Economics and B.A general Course. The instruction follows the CBCS curriculum as implemented by the affiliating University in all programmes, The institution integrates cross-cutting issue like professional ethics, gender, human values, environment & sustainability into the curriculum by observing National Days, World Environment Day, International Yoga Day etc, So that such values could be inculcated to give students the real feel.

Teaching-learning and Evaluation

The College has a well-organized teaching Learning and Evaluation System. The location of the college being in a Rural area, majority of the student of the students who get admitted here are under Free Waiver Scheme of Assam Government. The College tries to follow the reservation Policy of the Assam Government. The Institution Assesses the learning level of students on the basis of slow, average & advanced learners. Slow learner are given special care and attention. ICT-based teaching tools like Whatsapp group are used to supplement the classroom teaching. Regarding teacher profile our College may not be up to the marks. Two teachers having Ph.D Degree, two teachers are NET & SET qualified and three more teachers are undergoing Ph.D programmes and majority of the teachers having good teaching experience in the same institution. The students are evaluated on the basis of their performance in the internal examinations, attendance, and semester examinations. To Evaluate the attainment of outcomes, Curricular, Co-curricular & extra-curricular activities are organized in the College.

Research, Innovations and Extension

In matters of getting research grants and projects the college is lagging for behind still the College has constituted and publication cell to encourage and motivate the faculty members for research work. A number of teachers published research papers in the journals book having ISSN and ISBN. A few numbers of chapters have been published in various book the teachers are always encourage to peruse research work and they have free access to the college Library for relevant books and reference books. The teachers of the college have attended a number of regional, National & international seminars, FDP, FDP, Webinar & workshops, Organized by other institutions. The college provides the facilities like computer, printing and Xerox as and when necessary. Papers & book, thesis Published by different faculty members are available in the College library.

The college has carried out a good numbers of extension programmes at the initiative

of NSS, IQAC, and Women cell etc. The college is involved in different activities like social work, Health Awareness blood Donation camp, Environmental awareness, organised observation of important days by different departments and cell. The participation of the students in such programmes and activities is quite encouraging. Further, the college has a few collaborations and functional Mou with some neighbouring college for faculty and student exchange.

Infrastructure and Learning Resources

The college is situated in a rural area surrounded by beautiful natural greenery, measuring 6700 sq.mtr with total constructed land of 3511 sq.mtr. In this constructed area, the institution has 7 classrooms, 2 lecture halls, one library with reading room, one girls common room. Other than the college Compound there is a separate land of 37,939.2774 sq.mtr for the construction of playground, boys and girls hostel, staff quarter etc in future. There is a small play ground in the college campus for indoor and outdoor games. The construction of digital library and digital class room is under process. There are 5 nos computers for the use of library and office –staff and also by the faculties time to time. The college could not set up a computer lab for the students due to financial hardship and the institution is trying to accumulate fund for the computer lab.

Student Support and Progression

Students of the college are provided guidance and support to participate in various inter college and intra college sports and games completions. Sports equipments both indoor and outdoor are also provided to the student.

To encourage the students in the field of writing creativity a wall magazine is published named “Anurana” (The Echo). A special publication of wall magazine is published to aware the student about environment on the world environment day. The college has an elected Student’s union Body under the guidance of the teachers and principal of the college.

The college has a registered Alumni Association and the alumnae keep contact with the college and extend their help and support for the development of the college.

Governance, Leadership and Management

The vision statement is well manifested in all institutional activities. The college has adopted the policy of decentralization and participative management. The Governing body of the college is the supreme decision maker where the Principal plays the leading role in the governance and management of the college, research and development plan of the college is minutely chalked out by the college authority with the collaboration of the IQAC of the college.

For the inception of the college focus is given on smooth governance & Management, and ethical consideration. For the execution of these some rules and regulations are adopted in the form of code of conduct in different layers. The code of conduct for the Governing Body, Principal, Teaching and non teaching staff, students are clearly stated in the institutional profile and violation of these are strictly handed by the college authority. For financial transparency the periodical audit of the college is done under the instruction of the Governing Body. The institution mobilizes its fund received from the state Government for the infrastructural development of the college by setting up construction committee time to time

The college has constituted antivagging cell, Internal Compliance Cell, RTI & Grievance Redressal cell where students and non-teaching staff of the college are included for transparency and to avoid preferential treatment.

Institutional Values and Best Practices

The college has adopted some measures for promotion of gender equality among the students and the staff of the college. Through the initiative the institution ensures that no gender discrimination takes place. Representation of boys & girls is ensured in different cultural programs NSS, blood donation camp, involvement in different committees/ cell of the college.

The college firmly believes in "To serve men is to serve God" Several activities such as cleanliness, plantation, Awareness campaigns, distribution of flood relief etc. are carried out by our students time to time. The college has used LED bulbs in the college campus as well as in the classrooms as a part of energy conservation measure. The institution has facilities for solid waste management. Regarding water management, the institution has borewell but not useable because of access iron. But drinkable water supplied by PHE is stored in plastic tank with proper filtration and constructed water reservoir is available for the use of staff and the students. The college has made room for pedestrian-friendly pathways & banned use of plastic. Our college has never compromised with the idea of sensitization of the students and employees towards the constitutional obligations. The college has prescribed specific code of conduct for students, teaching and non-teaching staff, and governing body of the college. The National and International commemorative days, events have been celebrated by the institution to develop among the students qualities like creativity, togetherness and brotherhood. The institution is showing its commitment towards local people who have always craved for quality education at their door step.

In the context of bilingual aspects of teaching we have been using English as Medium of Instruction. In MIL (Bengali) subject importance is given teaching through mother tongue. For inculcation of sense of National Integration, transmission and preservation of culture, subjects like Bengali, English, Political Science, History, Philosophy etc. are taught in the institution. During Covid-19 Pandemic, teaching of those subjects were offered through online mode.

Students will get to know what is expected of them and teacher will understand what they need to teach during the course. The college empower the graduates to be prepared for competitive examination or for any Higher Education courses of their choice. The students should be trained to as to extract information to solve problems in a systematic and logical manner. The outcome analysis does an analytical study on student Performances, satisfaction feedback and employability index. The outcome analysis will help to find gaps and carry out continuous improvement to align with the mission of NEP-2020.
6. Distance education/online education:	The institution envisions to offer vocation courses through online and offline mode. Technology enabled learning has become increasingly important in current educational environment. As an affiliated institution there is little scope for providing distance / online education. During COVID-19. Pandemic, the institution successfully imparted online education via different applications like Whatsapp, Google meet etc and conducted internal examinations assigned by the University. Moreover, the institution has a Study Centre of KKHSOU to provide distance mode of learning to the degree aspirants.

Thus in nutshell, the ELC is very active along with the support of faculty members of the college.

These may include voluntary contribution by the students in electoral processes-participation in voter registration of students and communities where they come from, assisting district election administration in conduct of poll, voter awareness campaigns, promotion of ethical voting, enhancing participation of the under privileged sections of society especially transgender, commercial sex workers, disabled persons, senior citizens, etc.	The college is located in the rural area and most the students belonging to different families comes under the marginalised section of the community. Since students vary in their ability to comprehend and absorb, it is not possible to address the needs and expectations of individual students and expect a uniform learning outcome from them all in a teacher centric class. The teacher facilitates learning by allowing each individual student to comprehend at their personal level by ensuring their involvement in class activities so that they can absorb and grasp information at their own pace.

Teachers make classes as interactive as possible and encourage innovative thought and novel

interpretations. Field work, excursion, picnic and assignments are some of the means to utilise by the departments to provide experiential and participative learning.

Internal assessments are so planned so as to encourage students to work independently. Written Assignments are required to be submitted by students and their need to be done individually by researching on the given topic so as to enhance confidence, develop writing skills and hone style, apart from inculcating an interest in research activities. Group discussion, which help students to present their views to develop oratory power and self confidence.

Discussion and debates on contemporary issues are encouraged so that students can reflect and analyse by eliciting responses to the subject under discussion. Non- CGPA course include sports, art and participation in NSS unit of the college may help the students to integrate and learn. Regarding NCC we applied long ago but have not received permission yet from their end.

Student's representation in the administration is an important initiative taken by the college. 2.5.1 Mechanism of internal/ external assessment is transparent and the grievance redressal system is time- bound and efficient

Response:

Effective implementation of the evaluation reforms is done both at External and Internal level. The Evaluation process of the Sarada Charan Dey college is very transparent and accountable. The college has well planned Evaluation Mechanism. Throughout the academic year college conducts different sorts of Assessment Test. The schedule for tests are prepared and displayed on the notice board. Generally, college conducts two numbers of unit tests in a particular academic semester. Generally 1st Assessment occurs within the 45 days of class commencement and 2nd Assessment done as per direction of the university.

After assessing, papers are distributed to the students within the class room for their self-evaluation and if students are not satisfied then they are allowed to consult with the respective teachers. As the college has Examination centre, so the final evaluation of the students done under the guidelines of Assam University. All the teachers are bound to evaluate unit test scripts of the students and also do their duties as Invigilators in the Final examination. External flying evaluator is deputed by the university at the time of Final Examinations to make the overall examination system transparent.

As the college is located in the rural areas and majority of the local student's guardians engaged in the non-formal sector, so most of them are very reluctant to attend the meeting or to present in Parent Teachers Meets. So, here the college face the problem to display the weakness and strength of the students in front

of the guardians.

Redressal of grievances and Anti-Ragging Committee where students can appeal for haphazard situation, if rises. The College has installed suggestion/ complaint box where the students can drop their grievances or complaints. The complaint box is opened in the presence of the Principal and the faculty members.

If any issue which is very sensitive and critical then, strict disciplinary actions generally taken to resolve the matter as quick as possible. As the college is rural based institutions, so generally chances of grievances are minimal.

3.4 Extension Activities

3.4.1 Outcomes of Extension activities in the neighborhood community in terms of impact and sensitizing the students to social issues for their holistic development during the last five years.

Response:

The famous quote of Swami Vivekananda, "If you want to find God, serves man". To reach Narayana you must serve the Daridra Narayans-the starving millions of India.

The institution always gave focus on this quote from its inception. Since, the institution is localised in rural areas and majority of people are economically depressed, being an educational institution, it is very responsibility of the institution to serve the local areas in terms of physical services. In order to pursue this objective, all the teaching cum non-teaching staffs engage themselves in various extension services like-Swaccha Bharat Abhiyan in Hospital campus cum college, voters awareness campaign among the socially vulnerable section, vaccination drive during Covid-19 situation, distribution of relief under flood relief scheme, universal educational campaign, Blood donation camp, Plantation, (inside and outside of the College) and many others.

Besides, the college has appointed three to four numbers along with students to cater the various society related activities. The college has strong AVBP students' union, where the active student's volunteers are directly related to all those services.

Every year in order to aware the common people about the Sadak Suraksha Jeevan Raksha, under Road Safety committee, Hailakandi students have come forwarded to ensure the successful completion of the campaign.

The extension activities of the college is carried out under the following heads: -

The college has formed the ELC (Electoral Literacy Club) in order to aware the college students of the age group 18-21 years to get ideas about their constitutional rights and duties and familiarize them about their electoral process of registration and voting. 2. National Service Scheme (NSS)

He had recognised that the country could no progress is a desired direction until the students, youths, who are committee, sincere and dedicated to the nation were motivated to work for the up liftmen of the society. The college is situated by the side of NH-37. The college is in a rural area so its scenic beauty is quite appreciable. There is a beautiful temple on the left side of the college. If we see around the college, there is full of verdure and the hill Borail can be seen from the distant.

There are 9 classrooms including 2 halls in the college with the seating capacity varies from minimum 40 to maximum 120. There are well furnished desks and benches, white boards. The classrooms have sufficient number of doors and windows so that light and air can pass easily and maintain a healthy atmosphere. Other than classroom there is a teacher's common room, Principal's room, Office room, Library cum a small reading room, girl's common room, IQAC room in the college

Regarding computer equipment, the institution is managing by hiring laptops and in the computers from the teachers which are used by the students time to time. We are trying our best to set up a computer laboratory for mass use for which we have already approached to ONGC vide file no.- SLC/HR-ER/CSR(76)/Fund for School/2021.

There is an auditorium in our college with a sitting capacity of 500 people at a time. We organise all of our cultural activities like social week, fresher's welcome ceremony, farewell ceremony in the auditorium. One dressing room and 2 toilets are attached to it.

Our students regularly practice yoga and physical exercises under the supervision of yoga instructor who is one of our alumni. We observe National Yoga Day on 21st June every year and very recently our students observed Surya Namaskara week in collaboration with local villagers.

There is a playground of our college. Students play and practice cricket and football regularly. Our college football team participated in many inter College tournaments and had great zeal in their performance. Badminton is played in the college campus by both boy and girl students. There is very good arrangement of indoor games also. Both boys and girls play indoor games like Chess, Carom, Ludo etc. There are 3 washrooms for Boys and Girls, 2 for non teaching staff and 3 for teaching staff including principal of the college.

Three phase electricity connection is there in the college . One inverter is also there for power backup as power crisis is a common phenomenon of the area . Diesel powered generator will be installed in a short period time. For the supply of drinking water, one water reservoir, 2 plastic tanks with proper filtration is available in the college.

There is a small but hygienic canteen in the college which provides quality food and snacks at a reasonable price. The college authority does not allow to sale tobacco and cigarettes and keeps a regular inspection of the canteen.

Library Timings: The library kept open on all working days as per academic calendar. The Library remains open from 9:30 AM to 5:00 PM.

Loan Services: Library documents can be borrowed for home use normally during the lending hours as specified by the library professional. As per library committee guidelines loan period for students are a week (7days) and for faculty 14days (fortnight). In case of loss of book, the student or faculty is required to replace the book either of the same edition or the recent edition to the library or an amount equivalent to the current price.

Loss of Library Card: Library card generally issued after submission of Library Registration form by the student. In case any student lost or damage the library card then he/ she must give a written report to the office of the college

Reading Room facilities: Since the Library is temporarily shifted to new building so the area of reading room is very small but we are expecting that from next academic session the situation will be normal as

library will shift to its own allotted space along with its **property counter**.

Blended learning is the basic requirement of the modern education system. In order to provide quality and content rich education, ICT is most essential aspect. From the initial days of establishment, the college has always tried to develop its ICT infrastructure but due to financial hardship, the college has not been successful to implement it. Beside, as the college is in rural areas so the internet connectivity or network issue is there. Only after 2014, the college has got Broad Band services of BSNL, but the services are not regular. Therefore the college has limited this service to the library and office use only.

As the college has been provincialized with limited numbers of faculty and non-teaching staff in the year 2013, so it was very difficult for the authority to upgrade blended learning or academic system. However the situation has been changed after 2021 when the services of majority of the staffs have been provincialized so college has been able to allocate funds for its development.

With passage of time college received the grants from the DHE, Government of Assam to upgrade infrastructural development, so the college immediately prepare its Institutional Development Plan (IDP). In this IDP the college has given importance on the construction of new digital classroom and digital library free Wi-Fi Zone etc. At present the library is located in to the small lecture room but within this

session we will be able to shift to the new building of Library. The college is doing its best to implement blended learning mode in to the institutions. We are hopeful that within this year digital classroom facility and free Wi-Fi services will be accessible to all the students. We are also hopeful that within next AQAR submission to the NAAC the issue will resolved, and we will be able to introduce blended learning positively.

Green Tech initiatives:

Objectives of the Practice

1. To contribute in Climate change mitigation strategy.
2. To make Green surrounding of the college.

Context:

The college is the heart of the local village as it has established after long time legal objection. Since the college is the only higher education in the North Hailakandi, so it covers vast area. The college has been provincialized in the year 2013 before that the infrastructure of the college was not as per NAAC standard. But due to the effort of the college authority and dedication of the stakeholders, the college is trying to achieve higher level of miles stone.

1. The college is very near to Hindustan Paper Mill Corporation (HPC), so it is the main factors responsible for environmental degradation. It has directly effects air, water standard at the locality. So, from the establishment of the college, the founder members have given the importance on sapling of trees within the college boundary.
2. The college is in flood affected area and almost every year some portion of the college gets affected by the flood water. As the college is very near to Barak River, so during flood like situation water flows badly effects the infrastructure of the college. So, as a measurement to check the uncontrolled water flows, the contour planting system generally followed.

The practice

To make the campus Greenery we are trying to arranged sapling of tree in the front side of the campus and make the campus Greenery. However, as the college campus is flood affected and it is annual problem, so it is assumed that after getting fund from the Government, we are trying our best to make the campus green by sapling of trees above the flood level.

In order to make the campus clean and green, all the necessary steps have been taken to make the campus polythene cum plastic and smoke free. Besides, the college has beautiful garden in front of the administrative building, which is maintained carefully. The college has prepared IDP (Institution Development Plan) in relation to short term and long term plan but for which bulk amount of investment is necessary.

Evidence of Success

1. The District Administration has arranged the Plantation drive with collaboration with college
2. Students are sapling trees in front of the gate on the 5th June.

Problem Encountered:

The area of the college is flood affected so every year the college affected by water flows coming to nearby rivers. Under this situation every year most of precious plants dies . We are trying to accumulate financial support from the Government so that the area of college become above the flood level.

The present land of the college is very less and it may satisfy only the needs of the lecture classes and academic activities. However, the collage has 15 bigha of land nearby collage which has not been utilised so far due to huge investment. Therefore, if we get sufficient amount of funds then it will be helpful us to use unutilised plot of land in desirable way.

TITLE OF THE PRACTICE

Introduction of NSS programme.

Objective:

1. To inspire the students to buildup mindset of voluntary services.
2. To give them live situation of the society.

Context:

1. The students of the college are no doubt laborious but due to family issues or financial hardship of the family they are not in the position to develop their all-round development. Their incapability is due to their insolvency. Therefore, the college is giving them the platform to develop their mental and physical attitude so that they could face the real life problems and tackle them.
2. Although quality of the students of the college is an average but this does not mean that they are lazy and inefficient. On the contrary they have huge potential in themselves but due to ignorance they are unable to achieve success. The introduction of NSS has given them the opportunity to grasp the benefit in co-curricular activities.

The practice

1. The major problem of the collage is that majority of the students are coming from the social vulnerable section of the community. They are financially not so sound so before the completion of their courses they prefer to leave out the collage. As a result the collage faced the problem to form volunteers group for the long time.

2. Since the area is backward as majority of the students are belong to those family whose parents are daily wage earners. So the parents are very much reluctant to send their students in various activities or tour organized by the college. In case of girls student the students are ready to participate in the various social activities but the actual numbers is very less due to orthodox attitude of their parents.

Evidence of Success

1. The NSS volunteers have given their support in the Orunodoi survey organised by the District Administration, Haliakandi. In this survey, our volunteers have done wonderful job and they have received complement from the District administration to render their service genuine and seriously.

1. The Blood Donation camp which has been organised by the Lions Club in collaboration with Sarada Charan Dey College, in which majority of the NSS volunteers have come forward to donate their blood selflessly. They also support the Lions club in the entire angel to make the programme successful.
2. The collage has established NSS cell to develop the mental attitude of the students but as a matter of fact that due to their financial hardship they are unable to continue their service throughout their academic carrier.
3. The NSS has been formed to provide the scope for the students to get employed in the different NGO or other charitable organisation. But since in this district the students do not find such scope as these are very limited so they prefer to skip the NSS and employed themselves elsewhere.

7.3 Institutional Distinctiveness

7.3.1 Portray the performance of the Institution in one area distinctive to its priority and thrust within 1000 words

Response:

Sarada Charan Dey College is situated in a rural area. Most of the students are coming from neighbouring village and belongs to the socially and economically backward classes. Our College emphasizes more on girl-education. Earlier before inception of this college, educations of girl students were impossible after matriculation or maximum Higher Secondary level. This happened be mainly because of financial hardship and orthodox mental setup of the parents. Most of the parents were not so serious about the educational values and importance so they are reluctant to send their son and daughter to the nearby towns mainly Silchar and Hailakandi. Moreover, they were worried about safety and security of their children.

This college opened a new avenue for higher education for these deprived students mainly girls students. When the college was at ventures stage, the institution used to fixed a minimum amount as Admission fees which helped a lot to the parents living below poverty line. Since 2017 due to the initiatives of Government

of Assam, most of the students get admission in the college under Fee Waiver scheme. Due to this noble effort, most of the guardians have been able to enroll their children in the college this has widened the scope for the girls students to get education. It is a matter of fact that around of 80% of students got benefit from this scheme. This indicates that most of the students belonging to BPL category. After graduating from this institution many girl students (especially having Honors course) prefer to continue their study in Assam University. Some girl's students become successful to complete their Master Degree in different discipline from University and they get the chance to become employed. Sometimes they render their services voluntarily in the college as and when required.

The girl's students of these institutions are very serious and dedicated towards their study. However, as they are not getting all round support from their family or due to their insolvency they are not in position to continue their study. Therefore, this institution is best place to meet their needs. If the institutions get sufficient infrastructural facility they will not only come out from darkness of ignorance but also they may contribute to the society. The girls students of the institutions are very energetic as they have involve themselves in different activities of the college and even beyond the boundary of the college. In the Orunodoi survey conducted by the District Administration of Hailakandi, where most of the girls students have participated. The girls students of the college also participated in the different socio cultural programs of the college voluntarily as a result their confidence becomes high. This is the basis aspect where the college has always given its focus.

In the 21st century Girls are no way far behind the boys. In fact girls are more advance than the boys in some fields. This is true if we consider the case of Sarada Charan Dey College. Every year most of the show their interest to take admission in to Commerce with honor's but as the Commerce stream is still private venture so the girls are unable to take admission in to commerce as because their parents are unable to pay fees of commerce stream. It is the bad luck of the college that every year we lost many talent due to their financial inability. We are supposing that in the new future if commerce and science stream opens, then we may enroll them in the other stream also.

Besides, the college has vacant land near by the college which has been kept aside to construct playground, Girls Hostel in the near future. If Government releases sufficient amount funds then we are confident that within short period of time there will be massive changes in infrastructural facilities of the college. This will not only benefit girl's student but also ensure their safety and security. All the college is in remote area but we are trying our level best to inspire girl's students to encourage and energized them, but due to some basic issues we are unable to provide best result. Economic problem and social restriction are the two basic issues with which the students are facing problem mainly girls students. So, until and unless college does not give support to make impetus growth of the society the area will be always deprived and backward. Therefore, in nutshell we can say that the college has both opportunity and weakness. So, proper plans and development policy is necessary to uplift the social status of the girls student of the nearby area.
